



Ratby Parish Council – A New Chapter

For the first time in over 20 years, Ratby Parish Council has a new Chair. We are also pleased to confirm that the Council now has a full complement of nine councillors — the first time in more than two years.

We would like to formally thank our former councillors for their service and commitment to the community.

The new Council is fully aware of the scale of the workload it has inherited and the challenges ahead in serving a rapidly growing and diverse village. In the short period of time we have been together change is already underway, and we would like to share some of the progress made so far, along with our priorities for the coming months.

Strengthening How We Work

- **Clear Roles & Committees** – Each councillor now has a defined role and sits on one of four new committees: *Environment, Events & Community Engagement, Planning, and Finance*.
- **Improved Office Facilities** – Work has begun to secure a larger, more accessible parish office that better serves residents and is open at times to suit busy lives.

Building for the Future

- **5-Year Business Plan** – A long-term plan is being developed to guide all Council decisions. Residents will be invited to provide input once a draft is ready.
- **Neighbourhood Plan** – Work has started to give the village greater control over development and to protect Ratby from unsustainable housing growth.
- **Resilience Plan** – Following the major gas outage nearly two years ago, the Council is preparing a plan to strengthen the village's response to future emergencies.
- **Environment** – Investment is being made in local facilities, protecting open spaces, and enhancing biodiversity.
